Policies and Procedures

Dear Parents and Students,

Welcome to the Blakemore School of Music! It is our hope that this will be an enjoyable and rewarding learning experience. Students, we look forward to working with each and every one of you. Parents, we encourage you to be involved with your student's music lessons! The following is a list of our policies and procedures which all students and parents should be aware of so that our lessons will go as smoothly as possible. We look forward to another great year of studying music together!

Studio Mission/Teaching Philosophy

Our priority as music teachers is to share our love of music with our students and create a positive and encouraging learning environment. Students will study various aspects of music history, theory, technique, and performance procedure, in addition to the standard repertoire. Through the study of music, students will learn to strive for excellence while developing invaluable skills such as creativity, artistry, discipline, problem-solving, setting and achieving goals, attention to detail, and appreciation for beauty.

Hours of Operation

Music instruction will be offered at our private studio which is located at 895 Willow Run Lane, Winter Springs, Florida 32708. In-home lessons are available in the Baldwin Park area. Lesson times are arranged based on the student and teacher's schedules and will be determined on a first-come-first-served basis. Our administrative hours are from 9:00 AM - 5:00 PM on weekdays. If you need to reach us after hours for any reason, please email us or leave a voicemail and we will get back to you.

Weekly Lessons

Individualized instruction will be offered for each student. Lessons will be 30, 45, or 60 minutes in length, depending on the age and level of the student. Lesson time will focus on the individual development of musicianship, basic theory skills, technique, and repertoire.

Musicianship Classes

As part of our music education at the BSM, we offer group musicianship classes that all students are welcome to attend. These classes cover topics such as music history, famous composers, aural skills, rhythm, conducting, and singing. In addition to live events we may also host some virtual group events.

Practice Requirements

Practicing for lessons is an essential element for improvement. Time needed for daily practice can vary greatly from student to student based on age and level. We believe in a "task" oriented approach to practicing. This means that instead of telling a student "We expect you to practice for 30 minutes each day," we are more likely to give an approximate amount of time and let the student know which exercises and pieces they should make sure to complete each day. Students will be expected to come to lessons with their assignments completed and with questions prepared regarding anything that was confusing and/or too difficult to accomplish during their practice. Students that continually come to

lessons unprepared as a result of a lack of practicing may be required to keep a practice log so we can better determine how time is being used and help them develop better practicing techniques.

Attendance Policy

To ensure the cohesiveness of the studio, it is important that students arrive for their lessons on time. Once lesson times are decided for the semester, we are only able to adjust or change a lesson time as the schedule allows.

Due to our fully booked studio, makeup lessons will only be considered in the following situations:

- 1) if at least 24-hour notice is given prior to the lesson time
- 2) in cases of illness or family emergency

Makeup lessons will only be available if we have a cancellation in the schedule. We cannot guarantee that makeup lessons will be given, but are happy to work with you as we can. Make-up lessons will NOT be offered in situations with less than 24-hour notice, in cases of family vacation, other student commitments that arise, unexplained/unexcused absences, etc. While we do not give refunds for missed lessons during the semester, we will accommodate lesson swaps or offer openings when another student is absent as we are able.

If you know in advance of a time you will be absent, you are welcome to lesson swap with another BSM family, just let us know in advance so we can plan accordingly.

There are a few dates during the year that we will be absent due to concert obligations, conferences, etc. These dates will be marked on the calendar or communicated as known. We will provide makeup lessons for these circumstances as soon as the schedule allows. If for some reason we need to cancel a lesson due to illness, etc, we will communicate with students and families to make up the lesson as soon as possible at a time that is mutually convenient.

Recitals/Performances

One of the most important ways for both students and parents to recognize and celebrate hard work and accomplishment is through recitals and other performances. Formal recitals will be held at the end of each semester. Additionally, various other performance opportunities will be scheduled throughout the year around the community. These performances will allow the students to share what they are learning with each other as well as give back to the community. Students are highly encouraged to participate in at least one of these performances each term.

Student Progress Reports

At the end of each semester we will provide parents with a brief written evaluation of the student's progress. These reports will outline what was achieved during the semester, list the student's strengths, discuss areas for improvement, and set goals that we will work towards in the future. We believe these are helpful ways for parents to stay engaged in their student's musical education and for us to more clearly articulate what we believe the next steps are for each student's progress.

Tuition

Tuition is based on the length of the weekly lesson (30 min, 45 min, or 60 min) and can be paid by the semester (16 weeks for Fall, 20 weeks for Spring) or in equal monthly installments each term. The desired method of payment should be noted on the Student Registration form. The payment options are explained as follows:

Option #1 – (due September 1, January 1). Students who choose this payment option will receive a 5% discount. Please see the attached Tuition Schedule for details.

Option #2 – Tuition can be paid in equal monthly installments each term – 4 payments in the Fall and 5 in the Spring. Please see the attached Tuition Schedule for details.

Family Discount: Each additional family member enrolled in lessons will receive a 5% discount on tuition.

Late Payments: All payments not received by the 10th of the month will be considered late and will be charged a \$10 late fee and will begin accruing late fees of \$5 each subsequent day.

Listening Requirements

Students will be asked to complete 1 brief listening reflection each week, which can be completed online through the website. As learning music is similar to learning a language, it is impossible to truly grasp the intricacies and nuances without developing the musical ear. Thus, students are encouraged to listen to music as part of their curriculum.

Books & Materials

Students will need an assignment book which will be brought to each lesson (a regular notebook or lined paper is sufficient). Other books and materials will be assigned as needed and can be purchased either through a local music store or online. We are happy to provide BSM families with online links to help make music purchasing easier.

Parking & Pickup/ Drop off Procedures

For lessons held at the studio, parking will be available on the street around the house. Due to our fully-booked schedule, please knock on the door promptly at your lesson time. Students are not encouraged to come to their lessons early, so as not to disturb the lesson of the student before them. Parents are invited to wait in their cars, come back to pick up their children at the end of the lesson, or observe the lesson if they prefer. Siblings are welcome to wait in our studio during lessons as long as they bring homework or a quiet activity to keep them occupied.

Sick Policy

We ask that any student who is not feeling well please let us know in advance, especially if experiencing symptoms of fever, throwing up, etc. In these instances we would ask that the student stays home and if feeling up to it, is welcome to have their lesson online. Please do not attend lessons in person if you are sick!

Summer Lessons

Lessons during the Summer will be offered by request and will be flexible to accommodate vacation schedules and other summer activities.
